

Triticale 118

Triticale "118" is a spring-type, awned triticale that is fall-planted in the Central Valley of California. Its juvenile growth is erect, and at boot stage 118 is blue green, with leaves having a waxy bloom. Flag leaf is twisted and leaf carriage is upright. Stems of 118 do not have anthocyanin, and its necks are wavy and moderately hairy. Heads are middense and fusiform, with yellow awns. Glumes are tan and slightly pubescent. Seed of 118 is typically slightly wrinkled, amber, elliptical, with a brush that is midsize and midlong.

The variety appears to be uniform and stable, but can have some taller variants at a frequency of no more than 0.5%.
